If he’s warm and happy, then I’m warm and happy.” Cody is a young man experiencing homelessness in Colorado, and he’s received services for his dog, Dewey, from The Street Dog Coalition since 2018.

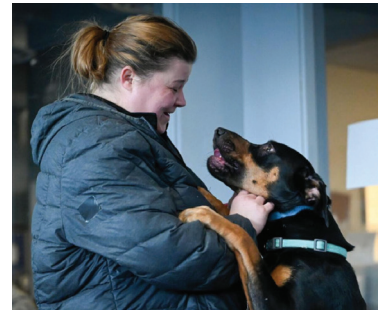
The Street Dog Coalition is a national nonprofit founded in Fort Collins, CO in 2015. We now have over a 60 teams across the country, providing free medical care and related services to pets of people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness. We care for the pet and its person by providing One Health services with compassion and zero judgment at our pop-up street clinics.

When asked about his journey since Dewey came into his life, Cody replied, “A lot of the weight in my backpack is dog food. I make sure he eats before I do. He gives kisses and hugs and always watches my back. He’s my baby and if anything happens to him, I’d be a wreck. He’s just the best. I like dogs better than people. They listen better.”

Our work starts with active listening. This is a fundamental piece of our four core values: Trust, Unconditional Love, Compassionate Activism and Unbridled Collaboration.

Trust: Trust is the foundation of this organization. We strive to authentically connect and build trust with everyone we work with and everyone we meet, on both ends of the leash.

Unconditional Love: Everything we do is done with love and kindness, without judgment or conditions.

Compassionate Activism: We seek the courage to “swim upstream” and always do the right thing.

Unbridled Collaboration: Our work cannot be done in a silo. We rely on supporters and community partners to help us think outside the box, complement existing resources, establish trust, walk-the-talk, and deliver accessible, quality care through tailored delivery models.

We continue to grow thanks to generous volunteers, donors, sponsors and community partners who are committed to protecting the human-animal bond by caring for both the pet and the person.
